The clinic will be a two-day event, Mar. 31st and Apr. 1st, at Glass Horse Farm in Raymore, MO.

On Saturday the clinic will run from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Admission for Saturday will be \$25 for non-members and \$20 for GKC members and includes, lunch, demonstrations and lectures from the trainers followed by a Q & A session.

On Sunday, the clinic will begin at 9:00 AM and will consist of group rides (no more than 5 participants) and instruction from the clinicians. Anyone wishing to participate in the group rides must sign up with Colleen Scott. The fee for riders is \$75.

John Rannanberg, of Rohara Arabian in Orange Lake, Florida, has won the Arabian Professional and Amateur Horsemen's Association Hunter/Show Hack Trainer of the year for the past three years and is nominated again this year.
