

MISSING HORSES - NEED YOUR HELP!

I have 2 chestnut horses missing/stolen (1 BLM). I don't know what else to do other than email everyone I can. I have called the police in both states, and the Brand Inspector. No body will do anything since I have a contract. I thought a contract would help keep me and my horses safe but the Police say it is a breach of contract and a civil matter that they can't help. I know hind sight is 20/20 and that I should have done more like make sure ALL my animals are marked, but now that they are gone what else can I do? I figure the more people that know the better. I have tried to either call or email all the rescues, auctions and vets. I am afraid that if anyone were to check on my mustang they would see she was titled and think I don't want her and just sold her. Please if there is anything you can do to help me bring my baby back let me know. I have had her since I adopted her in 2001 and have not given up on her yet even though she is still unbroke.

They were delivered to the trainer (Paul Heape) May 5th in Gridley KS, and I have not seen them since. No I did not owe him money. Neither the horses nor the trainer can be found. The trainer may be wanted in OK and KS.

Pictures are on the web site but I have a couple others of Christmas Fire and a drawing of her freeze mark. I just want my baby back. If anyone can help please email me, if not please forward the email on to others as that is a big help.

The description of the horses are as follows:

Christmas Fire (my baby) 8 yr old chestnut mustang mare with freeze mark (99212485) on left side of neck under mane. Thin strip or blaze on face, snip on nose. LF stocking, Right rear pastern. Has been haltered, lead, tied saddled/bridled but only ridden a couple times and is very hard to catch unless she is in a small area. This mare is a titled BLM mustang from the government. (the man in the photo is NOT the trainer)

Odie (a recent purchase which is why I have only a couple photo's of him)15+ old chestnut Quarter horse gelding. 2 hind socks and wide blaze.
